creation. ¹⁶ For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him."

We also see all Three present at Jesus'

baptism in Luke 3.21-22 $^{\prime\prime^{21}}$ When all the people were baptized, it came to pass that Jesus also was baptized; and while He prayed, the heaven was

opened. ²² And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him, and a voice came from heaven which said, "You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased."
